Things to Bring

The Touch of Nature Environmental Center can be a bit... rustic, and therefore attendees should be prepared to spend some time in a forested outdoor setting. In particular, visibility can be difficult on the pathways between buildings and the bonfire area, especially late at night. Therefore, all conference participants should bring the following:

- Warm clothes
- A flashlight
- Appropriate footwear for hiking or canoeing in the afternoons

Students or postdocs who are presenting posters should also consider bringing pushpins or Velcro for the evening poster sessions.

In addition to this, all participants who are not staying in the Little Grassy Lodge should bring the following:

- Soap and shampoo
- A towel and washcloth
- Shower shoes or flip flops

Finally, those who are staying in the cabins may want to consider bringing a sleeping bag, a pillow, or extra blankets. While linens are provided for all conference participants, the cabins are not well insulated and can get rather cold.
